2016 BAM Conference Report

President Phil Cox opened the 25th BAM Conference on Thursday evening, April 28th 2016, following the usual pot-luck dinner. He gave a brief history of the BAM conferences. The first conference was sponsored by Tom Clark and held at Potosi on April 25th and 26th, 1992. The following year, 1993, was the first BAM sponsored conference, also held at Potosi. Phil also recognized a 5 year old named Sam, Sid Suedmeier's grandson, as being the only person who has attended a BAM conference every year of his life.

The opening ceremony this year involved each past BAM president who was present, forging something simple. Bernie Tappel, the second BAM president served from '87 – '89, forged and demonstrated a flint striker from a piece of commercial garage door spring. Pat McCarty, president from '94 – '97 forged a folded leaf and wire brushed it with a brass wire brush for a gold finish. Bob Alexander, president from '97 – '01, also forged a leaf but used a chisel to define the leaf and stem veins. He also serrated the edges. Don Nichols president from '04 – '06, made an S-hook from 1/4" round stock. Ken Jansen, president from '08 – '11, also forged a leaf, but put a drive hook on the end to mount it to a post of beam. Phil Cox, president from '11 to present, tied a knot in a piece of 1/4" round stock. All presidential demo pieces were put in the auction Saturday.

Phil recognized the conference chairmen, but I didn't get all their names. The BAM web page has a very good "history" section that will list all past officers, as well as those who volunteered for special functions, i.e. conference chairman.

The forging contest was held Friday evening following another pot-luck dinner. Matthew Burnett was the organizer this year. He chose to have the contestants straighten a piece of 1/2" sq stock that he had previously bent with a loop

and right angle bend. There was a 5 minute time limit, and the straightest piece would be the winner. There were 18 contestants and winners were announced at the banquet Saturday evening. The contestants were:

The Lifetime Award went to Doug Clemens, and the Founder's Award went to Mike McLaughlin.

There were over 200 registered participants for the conference, which set a new record for BAM only conferences. Mike McLaughlin thanked all the volunteers, and a lot of new people who made the conference a success. Phil Cox thanked Don Birdsall for his work on the MTS, all the gallery workers, and Steve McCarthy, Joe Hurley, and Mike Gentsch for their help with the demonstrators. He also said we need someone new to step up and take charge of next years conference to give Mike a break.

Karen Bouckaert thanked Al from Astragal Press for his continued support of our conference.

Matthew Burnett announced the winners of the Friday evening forging contest: Neil Poort 1st, Jon McCarty 2nd, and Willy Bagley 3rd.

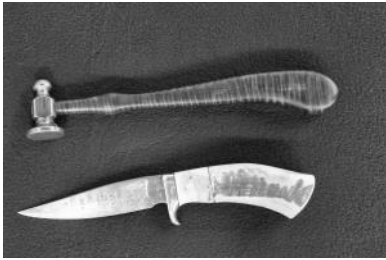

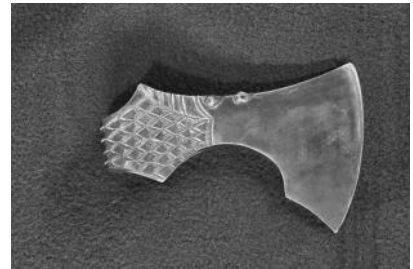

Meeting Minutes ~ June Meeting

Phil thanked Don Nichols for hosting the meeting and being the demonstrator. Phil also recognized and welcomed new members.

Mike McLaughlin gave a 2016 BAM conference wrap-up. Demonstrators were great. There were 206 registered attendees, and the auction brought in a record amount of money. The boutique also brought in more money than usual.

Bruce Herzog gave the treasurer's report and noted we now have 642 members, which is a new record.

Old Business:

Phil reminded everyone that we need someone to step up as conference chairman. Mike McLaughlin deserves a break and will hang around and help the new chairman. The job of chairman would be fairly simple with the help of a setup coordinator. The setup coordinator would be responsible for making sure each demonstrator site has what they need. He also suggested the BAM knifemakers get together and come up with more big name demonstrators.

Ken Jansen mentioned that this is Phil's last year as BAM president. If you want to be considered for the job contact Ken. Phil spoke highly of the joy of making so many new contacts interested in blacksmithing by being president.

New Business:

There was an impromptu chain repair during the conference that gave Phil an idea that we should do something similar at each conference. He suggested a chain committee be formed to enlist members to make chain sections that would be joined at the conference each year, and then be donated to the fairgrounds for display somewhere recognizing BAM as the maker. Contributors should put their touchmark on their links. Making links from 3/8" x 7" stock was suggested, and the 2017 conference would be a good time to start.

Mike and Nancy Gentsch had a conversation with

Steve Culver from the American Bladesmith Society Board of Directors, and past BAM conference demonstrator, about the possibility of a joint ABS Hammer-In and BAM Conference. Steve needs to discuss it more with the rest of the ABS Board of Directors, and Mike and Nancy will coordinate more with Steve.

Julie Cline from the U of M Extension in Madison County has an interest in conducting a blacksmith class near Fredericktown, MO, and was hoping BAM could provide some instructors and equipment. She was thinking it would be a five evening class, but might be receptive to using the MTS trailer and training format as a two day class. They have funding that covers each student's BAM membership so the MTS trailer could be used. The details need to be worked out.

The blacksmithing classes at the conference are very popular and draw new people to join BAM. There was some discussion about developing a self assessment criteria to allow potential class registrants to determine their skill level and the most appropriate class for them to enroll in. It might be based on the MTS class curriculum.

The BAM membership at the meeting voted to sanction Bernie and Patty Tappels "Old Retired Guys And Anyone That Wants To Take A Vacation Day" hammer-in to be held Thursday, July 28th 2016. Patty also mentioned she now has kid size BAM T-shirts.

Don Birdsall has all the material to set up the new MTS trailer, but will need some help getting it done. More information about the help needed will be posted on the BAM website in the future.

Karen Bouckaert mentioned that two BAM library books are missing. If you have a book that belongs to the BAM library, please return it. She also listed some new books she added to the library at the conference, and some new books donated by Ian

Wille.

Mike McLaughlin mentioned the Santa-Cali-Gon Days Festival in Independence MO is looking for a Blacksmith, or group of Blacksmiths, to demonstrate. They will be waiving the vendor fee for the entertainment. You will be able to sell your work. It is Labor Day weekend Friday Sept. 2nd. - Monday Sept. 5th. Setup is on Thursday Sept. 1st. in the evening. They had 300,000 attend in 2015. It would be a good opportunity to sell a lot of goodies. Go to santacaligon.com for more info. Phil Cox said the BAM owned PA system is broken, and he is looking for someone to repair it rather buy a new one. The hardwired microphones work OK but the wireless mics don't.

The meeting was adjourned.



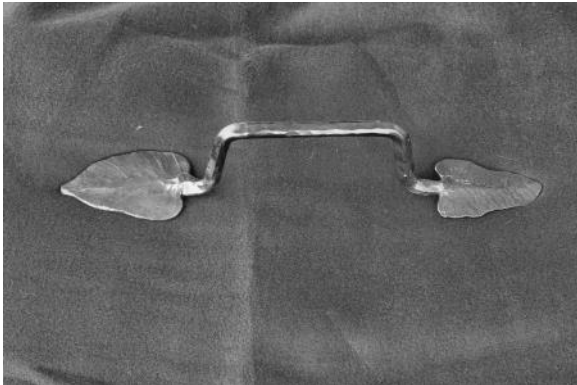
